

Drayton Hall Elementary's Ipad Take Home Initiative

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Why eLearning?

- DHES path to 1:1.
- Prepares students for the 21st century's ever changing digital world.
- Help students meet the demands of the South Carolina College and Career Ready Standards.
- Expands learning beyond the walls of the classroom.

When will the students take a device home?

- Students will be able to take their Ipads home on **September 19th**.
- Students will not be able to take Ipads home during S.C. Ready Testing, PASS Testing, or MAP Testing.

How will students benefit from taking an Ipad home?

- Anytime, anywhere access to resources, learning programs and educational apps.
- Application of problem solving and technology skills.
- Students can start building a foundation that they can use as they learn advanced usage for technology.
- Teachers have access to digital-age lessons that engage students on many different cognitive and sensory levels.

What happens if the Ipad breaks or is stolen?

- The Ipad is the property of Charleston County School District on loan to the students. Each Ipad will be identified by a code on the Ipad.
- Accidental coverage will be covered by the school.
- Intentional damage will be investigated on a case by case basis.

Does my family have the option not to take home the Ipad?

- Parents will have the option to NOT have the student take home the Ipad.
- DHES hopes that all students' families take advantage of this opportunity.

ACCESS TO WI-FI

- Students are allowed to access wireless Internet networks on their devices in order to have wi-fi access outside of school. Keep in mind that CCSD does NOT provide internet filtering outside of the district's network at this time. **PARENTS/GUARDIANS ARE RESPONSIBLE FOR THE ONLINE ACTIVITIES AND BEHAVIOR OF THEIR CHILDREN**
- Students will NOT be able to download apps.
- Only Teacher approved apps will be on the I pads.
- If you don't have Wi-Fi, there are public places that provide that service. Teachers will make accommodations as necessary.

Google Logins

- All students have a Google account provided by the district.
- The username is the first three letters of the student's last name followed by the first three letters of his/her first name and the last four digits of their student ID @ccsdschools.com.
- Thus, John Smith, whose student ID is 12345, would have a username smijoh2345@ccsdschools.com.
- Students should know their log in information.
- Students who forget their Google passwords may contact the classroom teacher for help.

Frequently Used Apps

- *Goodnotes: Used for note-taking and annotating PDFs.*
- *Pages: Primary tool for word processing.*
- *Popplet: Creating Word Sorts and Organization Charts*
- *iMovie: Often used for projects and other alternative assignments.*
- *Google Docs and Slides: Equivalent to Microsoft Word and Powerpoint, respectively. Less functionality, but much easier to share and collaborate with others on.*
- *Showbie: Turning in Assignments*

Ipad Usage Agreement

- Students and parents will be required to read and sign an Ipad Usage Agreement before taking home the Ipad.
- Upon signing this document, parents and students understand and agree to the stipulations set forth on the iPad Usage Agreement, the Student Mobile Device Responsible Use Agreement, and the CCSD Technology Acceptable Use Policy which can be found in the student handbook and school website.
- Please review these requirements carefully with your child.

Drayton Hall Elementary School Student and Parent iPad Usage Agreement

Any acts seen as not meeting this pledge are considered infractions resulting in consequences of limited or no iPad use.

I will take good care of my assigned iPad.
I will never leave my iPad unattended.
I will never loan out my iPad to other individuals.
I will know where my iPad is at all times.
I will keep food and beverages away from my iPad.
I will not disassemble any part of my iPad or attempt any repairs.
I will protect my iPad by keeping it in the assigned or school-approved protective case at all times.
I will use my iPad in ways that are appropriate and educational and in ways that conform to Drayton's expectations.
I will not place non-approved decorations (such as stickers, markers, etc) on the iPad, charger or case.
I will not deface or remove the serial number iPad sticker on any iPad.
I understand that my iPad is subject to inspection at any time without notice and remain the property of Drayton.
I will keep a photo of my face on the home screen and lock screen of the iPad.
I will follow the expectations outlined in the Drayton Hall Code of Conduct while at school, as well as outside the school day.
I will file a police report in case of theft or vandalism.
I will be responsible for all damage or loss caused by neglect or abuse.
I agree to return my assigned Apple iPad, case, and charging/USB connection cord to school in good working condition.



4.1 Mobile Devices Left at Home

If a student leaves the device at home, he/she is responsible for completing course work as if the device were present.

4.2 Charging your Mobile Device's Battery

Student devices must be brought to school each day fully charged.

4.3 Home Internet Access

Students are allowed to access wireless Internet networks on their devices in order to have Wi-Fi access outside of school. Keep in mind that CCSD does NOT provide Internet filtering outside of the district's network. **Parents/guardians are responsible for the online activities and behavior of their children.**

Digital Citizenship

- Students are expected to demonstrate DHES PAWS PRIDE in their digital activities.
- Includes being a good digital citizen; a key part of this is being respectful and responsible in digital forums (particularly social media).
- However, there are many additional aspects to proper digital citizenship.

Responsibility for the Ipad

- Students are responsible for their school-issued iPad and it is considered a required part of their school materials. **The iPad must be brought back to school each day.** Students will **not** be allowed to call home for a parent to bring in their forgotten iPad.
- Therefore, it is imperative that students take care of their iPad, keep track of it, and **make sure to charge it fully every night** in order to be prepared for class.
- An **annual fee of \$25** is required in order to participate in this program.
- The two most common ways Ipad are broken:
 - Inside an overfilled backpack that is roughly handled
 - Carried in the hand away from body and inadvertently knocked down

Care of Devices at Home

- Cleaning: Devices should NOT be cleaned using any chemicals.
- Chargers: I pads should be charged daily and the cords should be wrapped carefully for storage.
- Settings: Please do not change any settings on the Ipad.
- Repairs: Please do not attempt to repair at home. Notify your child's teacher of any damage or needed repair.

Safety

- Everyone should be extremely careful about sharing personal information online.
- Even innocuous information such as a birthday can give identity thieves the access they need.
- No reputable entity will EVER ask you to provide your password or account information in an email, nor will they give you a link to follow to put in such information. Always navigate through the official website if you have account security concerns, or contact the company on the phone.
